This document outlines how we intend to spend the Sport Premium Funding for 2016/17.





To renew membership of the Sedgefield Sports Partnership (SSP) at an Enhanced Level (£).	Provide access to high quality PE, inter school competitions, sports coaching and sporting festivals including:- 60 hours of High Quality Coaching 15 hours PE teaching support. 22 hours of afterschool clubs 11 hours of taster coaching sessions 9 Staff CPD courses	Feedback from staff shows that they feel more confident in the teaching of PE because of attendance of PE courses and coaching support. A greater number of children have taken part in afterschool clubs Children have attended 21 competitions, with over 300 children attending intra school competitions over the last year with Chilton Primary School having one of the highest attendances in comparison with other schools in the Sedgefield area.
To provide high quality experiences during breaktimes. - Key Stage 2 Sports Activity Leaders Programme	Children look after and care for one another because older children are trained as Activity Leaders. Improved emotional outcomes for all children at the start of the school day and increased levels of individual fitness.	"I really enjoyed supporting the younger children in school, running games during playtimes." Leon Y3 Year 3 and 5 children to continue the role next year. 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To support high quality after school activities.	Support and extend the range of school activities and high quality sports provision. Improve general levels of fitness and increase participation in after school clubs.	Gymnastics, Athletics and Physical Activities afterschool clubs run by the Sedgefield Sports Partnership as an added extra to the afterschool clubs run by Chilton Primary School Staff.
To provide high quality training to the PE Subject Leader, through the Sedgefield Sports Partnership CPD Programme.	Develop the role of PE subject leader by providing training to enable the school to meet the requirements for PE and school sport.	PE subject leader attending courses to support PE subject leaders in the use of sports premium money, monitoring of teaching across the school and the assessment and progression of children.

To provide high quality training to teachers and support staff, through the Sedgefield Sports Partnership.	Provide high quality and regular training to staff in order to develop quality PE teaching in school.	Staff given support from SSP Coaches to teach high quality PE lessons. The teachers, with support from the coach, gradually took more responsibility for the planning and running of the lesson sequence. Teachers can use planning and teaching activities in the 2017/18 academic year.
To ensure early identification of Gifted and Talented pupils in PE.	Gifted and Talented students have early access to appropriate specialist discipline coaching and intra competition at County level and beyond.	Gifted and talented children were selected to participate in 21 intra school competitions. Chilton Primary Netball Team gained bronze medals in the Hi5 tournament and 2 children qualified for the county finals in athletics.



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SSP to provide sports participation data and analysis reports to inform future sports provision planning.	Ensure future planning is informed and appropriately responds to pupil engagement and needs.	The reports created by the SSP will be used to write the PE action plan including the spending of sports premium money for 2017 /18.
